

### About the Project

The Energy Efficiency Plan for the City of Covina is part of a unified regional framework for meeting long-term energy efficiency goals. This framework will allow the Energy Efficiency Plan developed for each city to function as a stand-alone document tailored to individual communities.

The Energy Efficiency Plan:

- Summarizes the City's existing and future energy use
- Projects the City's existing future energy use (through 2020)
- Identifies energy efficiency goals and targets
- Creates an energy efficiency strategy to meet the City's energy reduction goals
- Assists in meeting State and regional goals of greenhouse gas (GHG) reduction and long-term energy efficiency
