



PROGRAM DESCRIPTIONS

PARENT AND ME - Ages 18 months-3 years

The Parent & Me program focuses on developing participants' motor skills as well as beginning to build the basic skills specific to the sport. Coaches will guide each parent/child group through a variety of fun exercises and games that encourage positive play and socialization. The season will conclude with a short informal scrimmage game.

LITTLE TOTS - Ages 3-4

The Little Tots program provides children with a fun and exciting noncompetitive environment in which they can experience sports for the first time. The first part of the program consists of drills and the last few weeks children play friendly games. Participants must be age 3 by the first day of the program - NO exceptions!

YOUTH SPORTS - Ages 5-13

The program provides instruction and fun for participants in a noncompetitive atmosphere. Sessions are led by trained staff who emphasize each child's individual skill development by raising self-esteem and developing a joy for the sport. The program covers fundamental skills, and scrimmage games are played to incorporate the skills taught.

EQUIPMENT REQUIREMENTS:

All programs require participants to wear closed-toe athletic shoes (cleats are recommended for soccer and Flag Football). *Soccer, Ages 5-12:* Shin guards required.



Dial-A-Ride Program for City Residents

Covina's Dial-A-Ride Program provides curb-to-curb transportation service within City limits for registered City of Covina Residents, and also travels to local medical and



government offices within a three (3) mile radius of Covina. Residents 60 years of age or older and those under 60 with an Access Services membership (or approved ADA Application) are eligible for the program. Dial-A-Ride provides travel assistance on Weekdays from 7 am-5:30 pm (last appointment at 5 pm) and Weekends from 7 am-3 pm (last appointment at 2:30 pm). Service is unavailable on select holidays.

Registering for Covina Transit Dial-A-Ride Service

Please bring required documentation (a government-issued photo ID card and a utility bill or other proof of residency) to the Public Works Engineering Counter located at Covina City Hall, Monday through Thursday from 7 am-6 pm. There is no cost to register and eligible participants are able to permanently use the service as needed once registered. Individuals living in the L.A. County unincorporated area of Covina can register for services with L.A. County Dial-A-Ride by calling (800) 439-0439.

- ⇒ Trips to and from City Hall, the Senior & Community Center and other City facilities are Free
- ⇒ Trips within the City of Covina and to the Eastland Shopping Center are \$0.25 one-way
- ⇒ Trips for appointments and to government facilities up to three miles outside of Covina city limits are \$2 one-way
- ⇒ Trips to Kaiser Permanente in Baldwin Park/Irwindale and City of Hope in Duarte are \$4 one-way



Can I tour the facility?

By appointment only. Please call (626) 384-5340 or email rentals@covinaca.gov to schedule a tour.

Are tables and chairs included in the rental fee?

Yes, for indoor facility rentals, tables and chairs are provided. The number and type of tables and chairs vary by location.

Are alcoholic beverages allowed at any rental?

No, alcoholic beverages are not permitted in any City building or City park.

How far in advance do I need to submit my rental application?

Applications must be submitted at least 45 calendar days in advance.

Do I get a resident discount when renting a facility or park space?

For some park spaces and facilities, the hourly use rate for Covina residents and non-residents differ. Please see rental application for pricing and general policies.

May I provide my own food caterer at my rental?

Yes, as long as it is approved by the Parks & Recreation Department, this includes "taco man" services. Food Trucks are not permitted.


- Jumpers and Inflatables are NOT permitted.


Fiscal Year 2022-2023 Budget

On May 17, 2022, the City Council adopted a balanced budget for Fiscal Year 2022-2023, with General Fund projected revenues and expenditures totaling \$46,320,250. The proposed General Fund budget utilizes \$4 Million in Transaction and Use Tax funds and \$3 Million in American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) revenue replacement funds.

The charts to the right provide a summary of how City services are funded, as well as the percentage of funding designated for each department.

IMPORTANT DATES:

The last day to register to vote for the November 8, 2022, General Election is October 24, 2022.

All California active registered voters will receive a vote-by-mail ballot for the November 8, General Election.

Your county elections office will begin mailing ballots no later than October 10, 2022.

Your General Election ballot will include:

- 7 Ballot Propositions
- Statewide candidates for U.S. Senate, Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Secretary of State, Controller, Treasurer, Attorney General, Insurance Commissioner, Member of State Board of Equalization, State Superintendent of Public Instruction
- U.S. Representative in Congress, State Senator, State Assembly Member
- Supreme Court Justices, as well as other local candidates and local measures.

Return your vote-by-mail ballot by mail with prepaid postage as long as it's postmarked on or before Election Day and received by November 15, 2022, or in-person to a secure ballot drop box, to a voting location or your county elections office by 8:00 p.m. on November 8, 2022.
