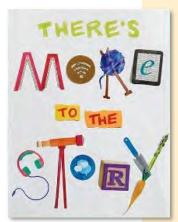

PARENT AND ME Ages 18 mos-3 years

This program focuses on developing participants' motor skills and building the basic skills specific to the sport.

Coaches will guide each parent/child group through a variety of fun exercises and games that encourage positive play and socialization. The season concludes with a short informal scrimmage game.

LITTLE TOTS Ages 3-4

This program provides children with a fun and exciting

noncompetitive

environment in which they can experience sports for the first time. The first part of the program consists of drills and the last few weeks children play friendly games.

Participants must be age 3 by the first day of the program - NO exceptions!

YOUTH Ages 5-12

Provides instruction and fun for participants in a

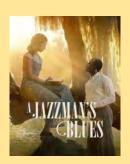

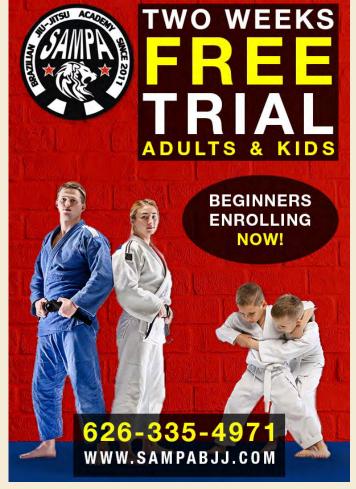

Application Process for Device Rebates

- Create an online account at socalwatersmart.com. A step-by-step rebate application video is available.
- If the qualified device(s) have been purchased, upload a copy of the water bill for the property where the device(s) is installed. Also include the invoice for the purchase listing the manufacturer names, model number and price.
- You will receive an email when your application has been processed.
- If the qualified device has not yet been purchased, purchase and install the qualified device within 60 days of your application.
- Next, follow the requirements in Step 2 for uploading documents.

SoCal Water\$mart is a region-wide program brought to you by the Metropolitan Water District of Southern California. Local water agencies may offer other incentive program opportunities. Rebates will be issued on a first-come, first-served basis until funding is exhausted.

The Public Works Department is responsible for the maintenance of City-owned trees located in the parkway (right-a-way) along City streets. Trimming is performed following a routine, systematic schedule program, which is comprised of pre-designed trimming grids trimmed in their entirety on a set schedule. By trimming every tree on the street regardless of size, every resident in the respective neighborhood receives service, and the safety and welfare of the community will be enhanced.

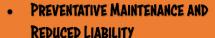

HOW IT WORKS...

Typical Municipal routine maintenance pruning cycles range from three to five years depending on budget. A four-year cycle allows for maintenance of every publicly maintained tree in a reasonable timeframe and reduces the amount of service request calls for faster growing species. In addition, with a four-year cycle, the City can tie it to an urban forest management plan that has a life span of 10 years or more, giving the City the flexibility to budget and program as needed and to respond to residents' concerns in a timely manner. This program also reduces the need for "emergency" maintenance, helps prevent liability problems (such as dead or weak branches), reduces tree mortality and improves the urban forest health and real value over the long term.

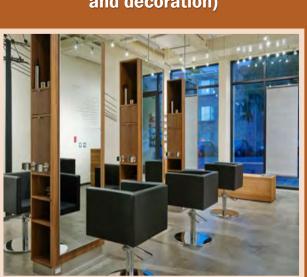
CITY OF COVINA BUSINESS CAPITAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ)

Can I tour the facility?

By appointment only. Please call (626) 384-5340 or email rentals@covinaca.gov to schedule a tour.

Are tables and chairs included in the rental fee?

Yes, for indoor facility rentals, tables and chairs are provided. The number and type of tables and chairs vary by location.

Are alcoholic beverages allowed at any rental?

No, alcoholic beverages are not permitted in any City building or City park.

How far in advance do I need to submit my rental application?

Applications must be submitted at least 45 calendar days in advance.

Do I get a resident discount when renting a facility or park space?

For some park spaces and facilities, the hourly use rate for Covina residents and non-residents differ. Please see rental application for pricing and general policies.

May I provide my own food caterer at my rental?

Yes, as long as it is approved by the Parks & Recreation Department, this includes "taco man" services. Food Trucks are not permitted.

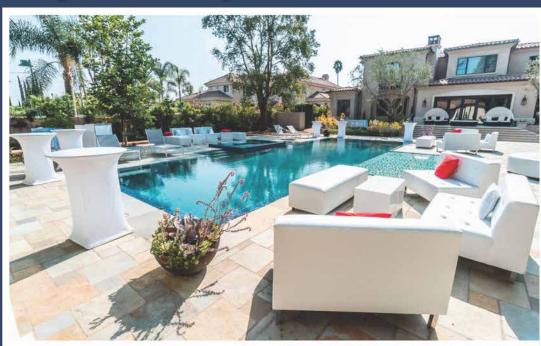
